Staff, Guests,	Staff and guests at risk of contamination during personal care tasks within a 1 metre radius.	Staff must wear gloves, plastic apron, a fluid protective surgical mask and eye protection where appropriate.	Gloves and aprons need to be changed each time personal care with a guest is completed. The masks can be used continuously while providing care until staff take a break from their duties (eg to eat, drink, take a break, or at the end of their shift).	Managers to provide P.P.E  Staff to ensure usage
Staff, Guests, Public	Staff and guests at risk of contamination within a 1 metre radius but not undertaking personal care tasks.	Staff must wear a surgical mask or equivalent face covering.  Masks and gloves need to be worn when preparing and serving food.  When staff can safely maintain a social distance of 2m during activities, periods of rest, at mealtimes or when out in the community masks do not need to be worn.	PPE is only effective in conjunction with good hand and respiratory hygiene, so staff need to be reminded to wash their hands, and not to touch their faces	Managers to provide P.P.E  Staff to ensure usage
